Ancient Gold Coin.—Prof. E. F. Rockwell, of the Female College at this place, has in his possession, an ancient gold coin, that was dug up in the lower portion of this county some time ago, and is pure gold. Supreme Court.—Monday, July 19, 1869.—All the Justices present. Opinions were delivered as follows: By PEARSON, C. J. In Stencil vs. Calvert; from Northampton co Judgment affirmed.

In Vance vs. Sumner; from Rowan co. (two cases), and in Avery vs. Hitchinson (three cases), from Rowan county.—Judgment affirmed.

By ROADS, J. In State vs. Hairston; from Forsythe county. Judgment affirmed, intermarriage between the white and colored races declared unlawful.

By DICK, J. In State vs. Jarvis; from Burke county. No error, judgment affirmed. In Mary McLaurin, ex parte from New Hanover county. Dismissed. In Davis vs. Pearce, from Wake county. Verdict for plaintiff.

From the N. C. Standard INTERMARRIAGE BETWEEN THE WHITE AND COLORED RACES DECLARED UNLAWFUL. In the case of the State vs. Hairston, Mr. Justice Roads yesterday delivered the opinion of the Supreme Court, as follows: The only question in the case is, whether the intermarriage of whites and blacks is lawful.

By our marriage act, "All marriages since 8th January, 1869, and all marriages in future between a white person and a free negro, or a free person of color, to the third generation, shall be void." Rev. Code, Chap. 68, S. 7.

It thus appears, that we have, not only the plain letter of the acts of the Legislature, but the sanction of the Constitution, that the intermarriage of white and black is against public policy, and is unlawful. And as this is a matter affecting the social and domestic relations, it is gratifying to know that the law has the sanction of both races.

It was insisted that the Civil Rights Bill has declared a different policy, and has changed the law. It is not necessary that we should decide whether the operation of that bill ended with the cessation of our provisional relations with the United States, or whether it is operative now, for by its terms it has no application to the social relations. Its object was, and its terms are, to declare equality between all citizens without regard to race or color.
