Great Increase In War Planes Is French Plan

PARIS, Oct. 28.—(P)—Immediate strengthening of France's military aviation forces to keep pace with armament races of other European nations was approved today by Premier Leon Blum's cabinet.

Official sanction of Air Minister Pierre Cot's program to modernize the French air force and to increase the number of ships was granted as the first business of a ministerial session.

CHICAGO, Oct. 28.—(P)—The nation's six presidential candidates will quietly cast their ballots a week from today and retire to the privacy of their firesides to await the will of the voters.

While the No. 1 men of each party spend the zero hour in comparative seclusion with family and friends, their campaign managers and champions will be at desk and telephone, testing the political winds for the first sign of victory.

Governor Alf M. Landon, his Republican opponent, will cast his vote in Independence, Kan., and then return to the yellow brick executive mansion at Topeka to learn the answer of the electorate.

Both Dr. D. Leigh Colvin, prohibitionist, and Earl Browder, Communist, will seek home and hearth to listen to the returns, their headquarters declared.

ed, although it won't be official until the college of electors says so. And it won't "talk" until the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December.

Textbooks, guidebooks, the constitution itself failed to make the functions of an elector clear; it was therefore necessary to track one down. This has been done.

Honored above his fellow party members, he is notified by the state committee that he has been appointed an elector. He thereupon becomes a member of perhaps the most exclusive college enrollment in the country, if not the world.

On the first Monday after the second Wednesday in December he says good-bye to kith and kin. He takes a train to the state capital. He meets his fellow electors, strikes up friendships. All pose for pictures.

There is a luncheon, en masse. The governor may receive them as honored guests.

The amenities observed, the electors hold an organization meeting, choose a chairman and are called to order. Each collector is given a ballot.

Now comes the most momentous moment in the career of an elector. One of them puts the president in nomination. As each man casts his vote he signs the rolls. (Sometimes engraved ballots are kept as souvenirs).

Once more there is a nomination—for the vice president. Again the electors cast their ballots and sign the roll.

Thereupon all receive checks for their expenses from the secretary of state. They shake hands all around and "drop in to see me some time" is heard, or perhaps—"I'm catching the 4:15; can you make it?"

The rest of the job devolves upon the secretary of state who sends the certified ballots to the secretary of state at Washington for transmission to the two houses of congress in their joint session. There the ballots are tabulated by states.

But while the elector's job is over after he has voted, his fun may continue. In 1933, all the electors in the union were invited to attend

the inaugural ceremonies at the capital as special guests of honor, the first time in the nation's history this has happened. Souvenir books were handed each. Their delighted posterity no doubt will show these and exclaim: "Sure my father was a college elector."

No Trace Found Of 3 Convicts

CARTHAGE, Oct. 28.—(P)—Officers reported today that no trace had been found of three honor grade convicts who escaped from the prison camp here Sunday night.

The fugitives are Marion Bradley, serving a term for second degree murder; Percy Newsom, serving a term for larceny with firearms and storebreaking; and Melvin Mintz, sent up for automobile theft.

After walking away from the camp, the prisoners hid near the home of Dr. R. L. Felton, the resident prison physician, held him up as he drove home, and took his car, in which they escaped.

Before driving away they cut the telephone wires to the physician's house.
