A painful or unpleasant e perience, say with a dog, fire water, may condition the child fear these unduly. Under such cumstances the child would he to be re-educated by additional periences. Such reeducation can be forced upon the child, but my be offered to it gradually and with a surrounding atmosphere of surance and security.

Where the fear is not rooted experience, a careful study of the child's fear is quite likely to r veal that it arose from a fault association of observations facts. Usually the child's reasoning powers are good, but its stock knowledge is limited. Sympathe inquiry can elicit from the child reconstruction of its fear gene and by a correction of the error eous deductions, the child's fear may be dissipated.

Not infrequently children's fear require the expert handling of trained psychiatrist, and when the parents' attempts at the resolution of the fear have failed, it is desir able that such help should be a cured. Adults, however, can co tribute much in safeguarding chil dren against psychic damage having what might be termed wholesome respect for the fears
