American Colony of Rio De Janiero Awaits Expected Visit by President Roosevelt



REPRESENTATIVES of twenty-one nations of the western hemisphere are today converging on the city of Buenos Aires, capital of the Argentine, where the Pan American conference opens on December 1 to discuss the possibility of an all-American League of Nations.

"But of these twenty-one nations," according to an article in the initial issue of Life Magazine, "the biggest and perhaps the potentially richest will not be the United States of America, but the United States of Brazil."

And in glamorous Rio de Janiero, capital of that vast empire of tropical jungles and sub-tropical plains, the American colony eagerly awaits the expected visit of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, who, it is hoped, will be able to pay a short visit to beautiful Rio should he attend the Buenos Aires gathering.

An invitation has already been extended by President Getulio Vargas of Brazil, presented in Washington by the Brazilian Ambassador, Oswaldo Aranga. Many Americans in the Brazilian capital hope that President Roosevelt's warship will arrive there on Thanksgiving day, so that they may hear the President give his Thanksgiving Day proclamation from an American cruiser in a foreign port.

Latest Rio de Janiero dispatches, however, indicate that the president may not arrive before November 27th, the day after Thanksgiving.

"The wealth of Brazil funnels into the capital, Rio de Janiero," according to the Life article, "to make it one of the world's greatest pleasure cities. Rio citizens who call themselves Cariocans spend most of their time in the area shown in the left of the panorama picture. Here are the

shops and offices, the Archbishop's and the President's palaces, and the great boulevards." On an adjacent hill, facing the Sugar Loaf, is a gigantic 130 foot statue of Christ, which dominates the colorful scene below.—From Life Magazine.

Barnes Again Is In Hands Of Law

CHARLOTTE, Nov. 19. —(AP)—Robert Barnes, one of two negroes whose feet had to be amputated after the negroes were put in solitary confinement at a Mecklenburg county prison camp, was arrested today for the shooting of another negro.

The story of Barnes, and another negro convict, William Shropshire, that their feet froze while in confinement, caused an investigation of conditions at prison camps last year.

IMPROVE QUARTERS FOR STATE PRISON CONVICTS

RALEIGH, Nov. 19. —(AP)—Five hundred central prison convicts awoke this morning in strange surroundings and from a night's sleep on cotton, instead of straw mattresses.

They had been transferred last night to new cell blocks in the west wing of the prison as the east wing, from which they were vacated, is to be renovated.

The new cell blocks were painted in green, cream and blue and each cell had a private sink.

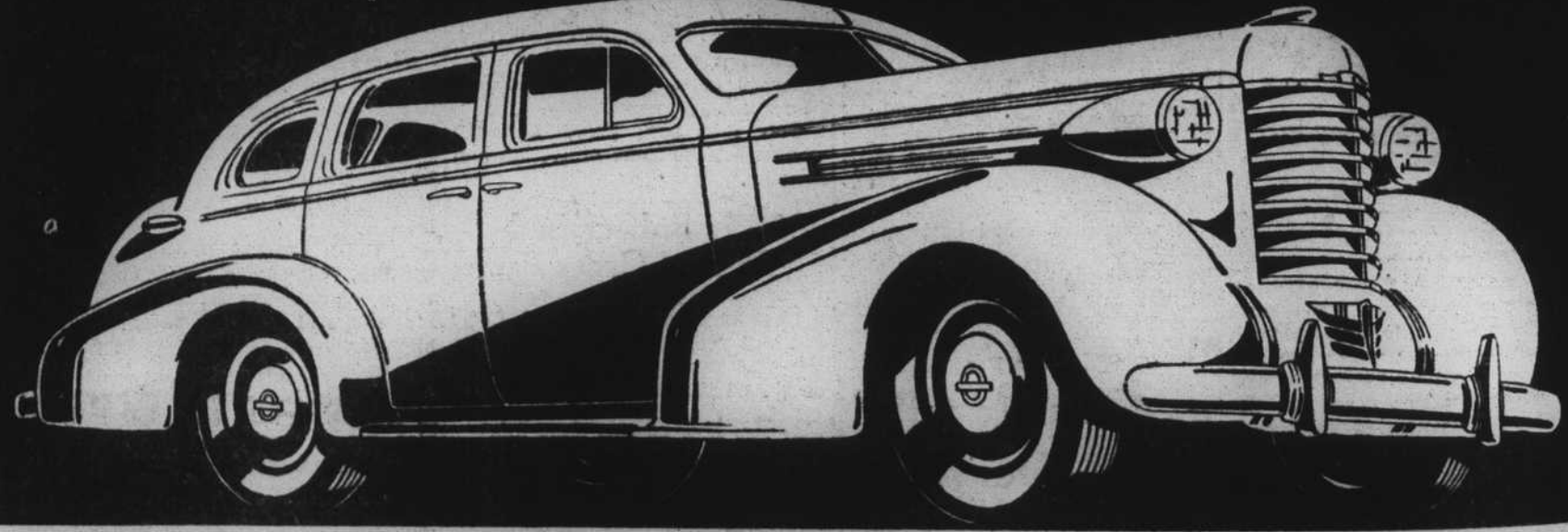

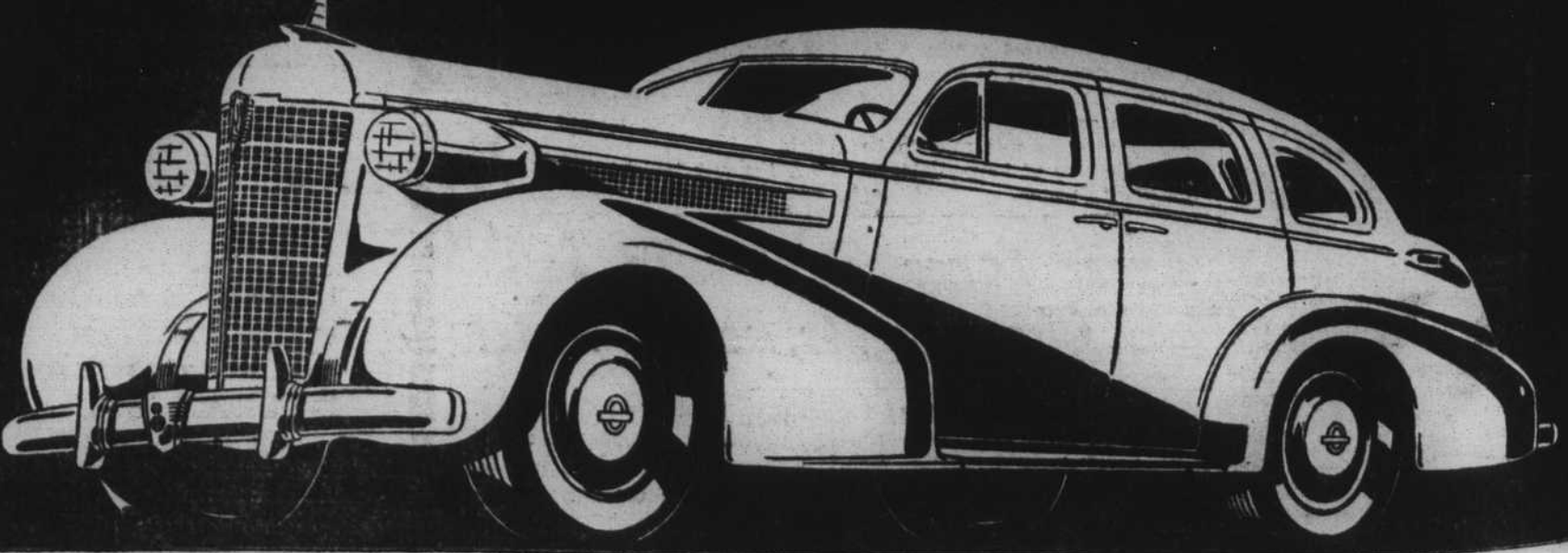
