TIES LOOSENED

LONDON, Dec. 18 .- (A) - Separation of the Church of England and the state may have been brought nearer by the Archbishop of Canterbury's criticism of the friends of former King Edward VIII, some observers said today.

Should the controversy over the speech spread, they said, the church might be severed completely from the state in England, thus losing its government subsidies and official position.

Park said the 65-year-old officer told him of stalking from house to house through dark yards and streets, firing shots from his service pistol at onetime friends and neighbors.

Spanish Boat Leaves As U. S. Flag Is Run Up FEAR ASSAULT

LONDON, Dec. 18-(P)-A Reuters (British) News agency dispatch from Gijon, Spain, today said the Spanish fascist cruiser Espana fired three shells which struck near the United States gunboat Erie off
