Growers Hold Power To Draft Cotton Program

MEMPHIS, Jan. 26. —(AP)— A committee of producers held today the power to draft a cotton program for the National Cotton Council to recommend to congress. The committee will draw up a plan for submission to the board of directors, who will send it to council delegates for a vote. If passed, it then will be submitted to Congress.

Headed by R. E. Short of Brinkley, Ark., president of the Arkansas Farm Bureau Federation, the committee was authorized in a resolution at the council's producer section showed reluctance to commit their followers to a new program at the moment. In a resolution the council asked elasticity of price ceilings on cotton textiles to conform with cotton ceilings. **COST CEILING** The council urged that the cotton textile ceiling on each item be not less than the sum of cotton cost, conversion cost and reasonable profit. The resolution said "adjustments should be made at suitable designated intervals so that the cotton cost allowance will continue to reflect changes in the average market price of cotton," and added: "The adoption of this provision will make unnecessary continuation of the present government cotton purchase program which has been unsatisfactory."

Large Still Seized In Kings Mountain Battleground Area

GAFFNEY—Another large distillery was destroyed Tuesday in the Kings Mountain battleground area within a quarter of a mile of the site where a mammoth steam-er still was found shortly before Christmas. This was the third big still destroyed in that area in the past few months. The last outfit included a 200-gallons capacity copper still, and 16 vats holding 200 gallons of mash each. Four additional vats were under construction. The officers found 11 gallons of freshly-run whiskey, 800 pounds of meal, a supply of shorts, a number of fruit jars, and other items. The raid was conducted by Federal officer W. C. Richards and Rural Officers E. C. Cornwell and Dewey Martin of Sheriff Lee Allison's staff. Mr. Richards and State Constable Roland T. Clary destroyed a 300-gallons sheet iron outfit full of mash Tuesday morning on Gilkey creek.

S/Sgt. Leroy Bright Killed In Belgium

OPA AUTHORIZES RATION-FREE SALE OF SHOES

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26. —(AP)— OPA today authorized a ration-free "odd lot" sale of men's and women's shoes, beginning Feb. 19 and ending March 3.

The agency estimated that more than 4,500,000 pairs of shoes will be sold during the two-week ration holiday. This represents only about 3 percent of rationed shoes in wholesale and retail stocks. The last ration-free "odd lot" sale was held July 10-30, 1944, when 5,785,000 pairs were sold.
