Dislodge Bomb From Bay Of B-25

MIAMI BEACH, Fla., March 3.—(AP)—First Lt. David L. Atkinson wears the soldier's medal today for dislodging a huge fragmentation bomb that threatened to explode in the bomb bay of his B-25 during a mission over southern France last August. As bombardier, the Charleston, W. Va., officer was the "logical man" for the delicate job of separating the bomb from the plane. He removed his parachute and crawled down into the open bay to dislodge the bomb with his hands. "It wasn't difficult," he said at the AAF redistribution station here today. "But I had to be careful. If I'd made a wrong step it would have been 'Atkinson away' that day."

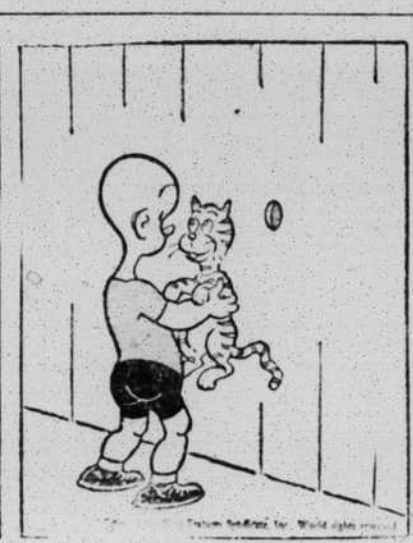
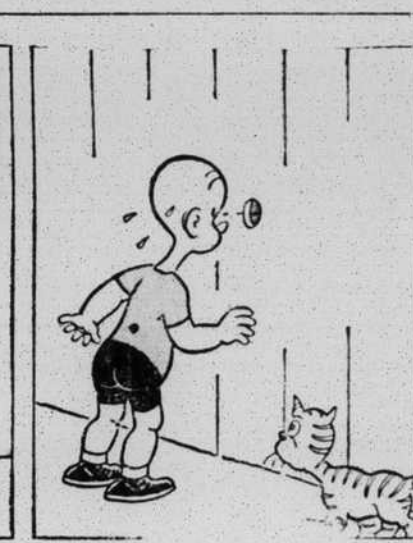
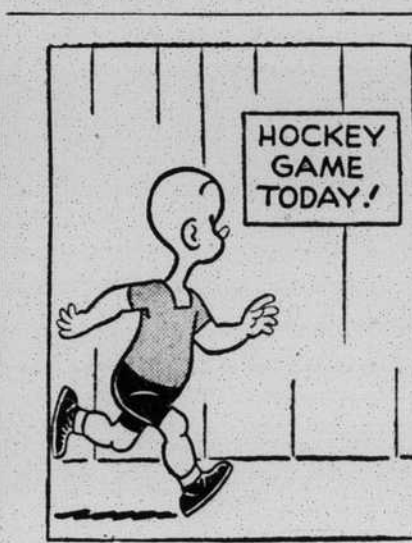
