of one of the rifle companies became a casualty. Lacking in leadership, the attack halted and the company suffered heavy casualties from an intense mortar and artillery bombardment.

Observing the situation, Col. Goforth advanced and assumed personal command of the company. While revitalizing the attack, he was wounded in the shoulder by shell fragments. Refusing immediate evacuation, he remained with the forward elements of the unit until the assault gained impetus. Although wracked by pain, he went to the regimental command post, where he insisted on reporting in detail the situation and condition of his battalion before being evacuated.

Cpl. Goforth's courage, tactical skill, and complete application to duty corrected a condition that might have caused serious losses, and are in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service.

**WAC MEDICAL QUOTAS ARE BEING MET**

CHARLOTTE — "For the first time in over a year we are meeting our Wac medical technician quotas," Lt. Col. William Schilleter, commanding officer of the Carolina district army recruiting station, said today.

"It seems to me that for the first time since the war began the women of North and South Carolina are fully recognizing their responsibility and are doing something about it," he added.

But although Col. Schilleter expressed gratification at the present response of those women who have joined the Wac as medical technicians he explained that the need for such women is still greater than at any time during the war.

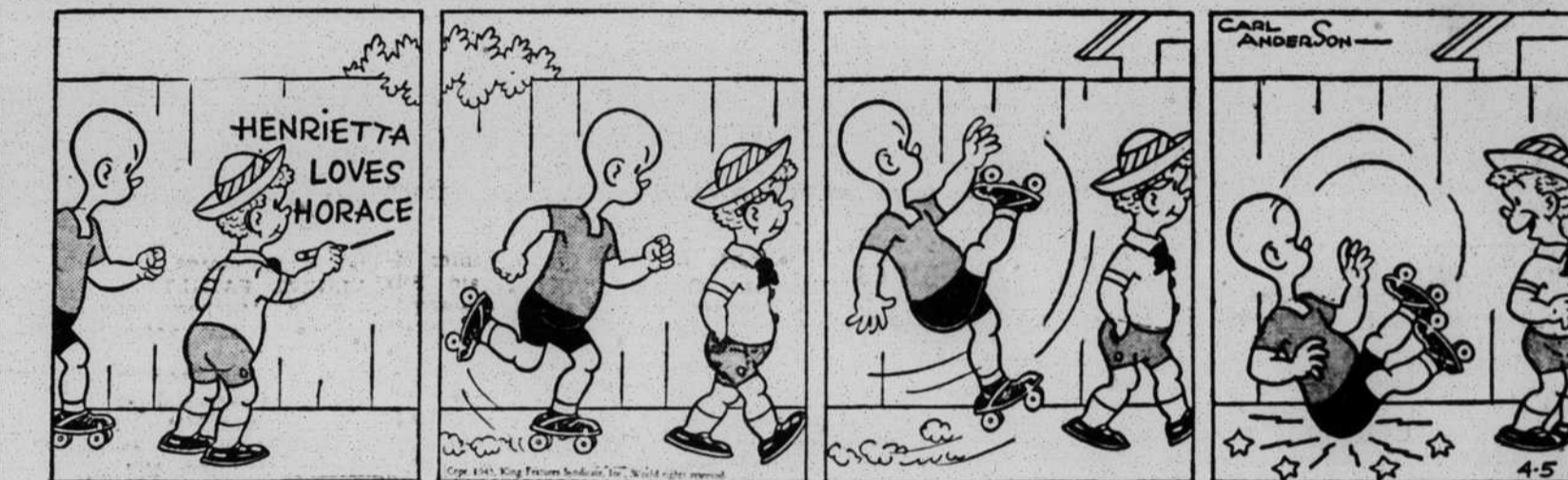

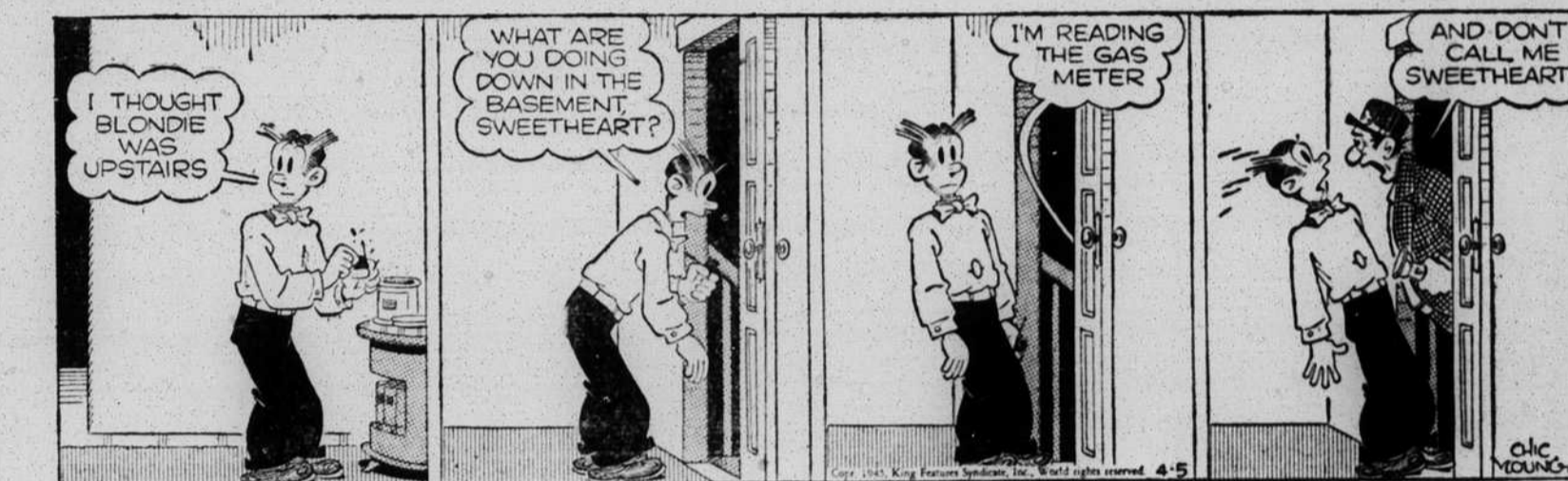
