A special circular to agents says: "We send you this circular to let you know that your money has just been received, and that on account of a large number of orders being on hand before yours, it would be two or three days before your pencil and gift could be sent. We will send it in the shortest possible time, so you may rest easy that your money has arrived safely, and that all will be made right soon." We thought this a better plan than to have an agent in suspense, causing him to write us on account of the delay. Another says: "The prices are distributed on a simple plan of drawing, which would take too much room to explain, but which has never failed to give complete satisfaction." And still another said that "agents should be careful to write names distinctly, and give their post office address in every letter."

The whole thing has proven a complete swindle. Yesterday, about 300 letters were taken from the Post Office, addressed to Todd & Co., 65 of which were registered. The receipts would average about \$300 a day. Mr. Todd was brought before the Mayor, and held to bail in the sum of \$1,000.

**The Democratic Candidate.**—Meetings in Albany, Asbury, Utica and Columbus have nominated Judge Ellis. St. Louis County has nominated Mr. Holden.

**A New Route for Goods.**—The Newbern Express of Friday last says that a quantity of goods has just arrived there in a schooner from New York, for market in Salisbury.
