

thus limited in its extent could in no just sense be regarded as a transfer of the war-making power to the Executive, but only as an appropriate exercise of that power by that authority to whom it exclusively belongs. The riot in Panama, in 1850, in which a great number of our citizens lost their lives, furnished a pointed illustration of the necessity which may arise for the exertion of this authority.

I therefore earnestly recommend to Congress, on whom the responsibility exclusively rests, to pass a law before their adjournment, conferring on the President the power to protect the lives and property of American citizens in the cases which I have indicated, under such restrictions and conditions as they may deem advisable.

The knowledge that such a law exists would of itself go far to prevent the outrages which it is intended to redress, and render the employment of force unnecessary. Without this, the President of the United States may be placed in a painful position before the meeting of the next Congress. In the present disturbed condition of Mexico, one or more of the other Republics of South America, or persons in those countries, may place him in a difficult position.

In case of emergency, our citizens, seeing that they had no remedy by the same process with the subjects of European Governments, will have just cause to complain. On the other hand, should the Executive interfere, and especially should the result prove disastrous and valuable to us, he might subject himself to severe censure for having assumed a power not confined to him by the Constitution. It is to guard against this contingency that I now appeal to Congress. Having thus recommended to Congress a measure which I deem necessary and expedient for the interest and honor of the country, I leave the whole subject to their wisdom and discretion.

A partial debate took place on the motion to refer the message to the Committee on Foreign Relations.

Measures, Cunningham and Benjamin spoke briefly in support of the views of the message.

Mr. Seward considered that it was a bad and right to see the President of these United States asking Congress to confer on him the war-making power, in order to subordinate his functions to those of European Governments. The passage of a bill granting the President such power was, however, voted in the Senate, and overruled by the powers of Congress and the opposition to the express prospects of the Committee.

Mr. Foote spoke in similar terms, and cited the Paraguayan expedition, which was to consist of a single ship, and was now an armada of twenty sail, as an instance of how the President might plunge the nation into war. The President now comes forward and asks for general powers. It would be more rational to take initiative steps at once to have a king, than blindly confer absolute powers.

Mr. Douglass was glad the President had called attention to this subject. He considered the President ought to have power to keep open the transit route, and to protect citizens and commerce. He ought to be invested with power similarly to enforce rules for any outrage committed upon our flag, citizens or property, wherever it occurs. The Executive of every other nation has it. Mr. Douglass did not mean to give a special vote of confidence in the present Executive strong enough to make the American name respected, but not足以 increase the Executive power within the United States. He hoped this message would originate a more vigorous and efficient foreign policy.

Mr. Davis of Mississippi, could not concur in the doctrine of Mr. Douglass to its fullest extent. There is no forewarning to what limit it might not extend, if urged by ambition, or any other feeling. That we want to invest the Executive with more power than our fathers gave, only marks the decadence of the American people. Mr. Davis would prefer the delay of Congressional action to the surrendering of a great constitutional principle. But he did not understand the President's meaning for, under or like possible powers. The transit route was constructed by American citizens with American capital, and is, therefore, an exceptional case. Mr. Davis would grant him the power, but would limit it to the special case first mentioned.

Mr. Green obtained the floor, and expressed himself as ready to go on with his remarks, when several Senators proposed to adjourn, whereupon Mr. Green said this was one of the most important messages ever before the Senate, and ought to be carefully considered. Adjourned.

SALT FOR HOUSES. — Common salt abounds throughout India, and although little English salt is imported, it is used in large quantities for keeping the foodstuffs and loads of various articles.

Estimates of salt in India are as follows: The total salt produced is about 1,200,000,000 lbs. By far the largest amount is produced joint with a sufficient quantity of salt, however, from the sea, cannot be avoided. It is a very difficult task with some blockades to import salt in order to render it more salable, but salt being so expensive to carry, it affects this object.
