THE UNION MASS MEETING IN PHILADELPHIA.

While no many journals appear anxious to prepare the minds of the people for discussion, by withholding from their readers all expressions that look like sympathy with the South, we may be pardoned for devoting most of our editorial space, for one hour, to the proceedings of the Union mass meeting in Philadelphia on the 7th inst.

The Philadelphia Ledger comes to us filled with the speeches and resolutions on the occasion, the object being to maintain all fair-minded and upright citizens to the Union and the Constitution. Hon. Joseph H. Ingersoll presided, assisted by seventy-five Vice Presidents, among whom we noticed Hon. Henry M. Fuller.

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted:—*Petersburg Intelligencer.* The citizens of Philadelphia, assembled in general town meeting, desiring at this juncture to express an earnest sympathy with their fellow citizens of Virginia, recently threatened with an attempt to produce a servile revolt, have:

1. Resolved, That the longer the government of the Union exists, with its manifold and inextinguishable wrongs, the more is it hated by the millions of North, South, East, West, and our common country; whose integrity the Constitution alone secures, and whose integrity the Union harmonizes and protects.

2. Resolved, That, in the judgment of the citizens of Philadelphia, the sentiment of fealty to the Union would be fruitless, did it not imply a recognition, implicitly and practically, of the right to secede, and carry honestly into execution, all the laws of Congress, enacted under the Constitution.

3. Resolved, That no part of the Constitution of the United States, or of the laws of Congress, are more obligatory on the citizens of the Republic, than those which prescribe the duty of electing, under judicial process, fugitives from labor, and that all attempts or communications, to defraud or frustrate those provisions, and all legislation to the same end, are condemned by the judgment of this community.

4. Resolved, That, in view of what has recently occurred in the Commonwealth of Virginia, the citizens of Philadelphia desire, as they have always done, any right or wish to interfere with the domestic institutions of their sister State.

5. Resolved, That they repudiate, in the strongest and clearest terms, all attempts, whether by invasion, secret instigation, or the promulgation of any form of insidious opinions, to excite, incite, or to incite those who are lawfully bound in servitude to violence and bloodshed.
