THE FEDERAL REVENUE

In the Treasury Report of Secretary Chase to the Lincoln Congress, he states that the budget for the last fiscal year ending the 30th of June, was only \$2,571,246 33. This is in the face of nearly two millions of dollars more...

In addition to all this, if we understand it rightly, should the army be increased to 400,000 men, as recommended by Lincoln, there will be \$100,000,000 more to be raised, besides the \$218,000,000. Will they get it? We shall see.

The bankruptcy of a man or a government that spends three times as much as is received, is plain enough; but when the expenditures reach fourteen times as much as the income—three hundred and eighteen millions against twenty-two millions—the creditors may well stand aghast.

It is hardly to be doubted, moreover, that the great body of the citizens of the States now involved in the calamities of insurrection will, ere long, become satisfied that order, and peace, and security for all rights of property, and for all personal and political rights in the Union and under the constitution, are preferable to the disorder, and conflict, and incertainty necessarily incident to the attempts to subvert the government, break up the institutions, and destroy the nationality by force and violence.

The great body of citizens of the Southern States are not particularly encouraged to hope for such security of rights of property and of personal and political rights, by the robbery daily perpetrated by our loving Northern friends, and by the arrest and imprisonment of our best citizens without and against the authority of the Constitution and laws.

DEPARTURE OF NURSES.

We are pleased to learn that three or four ladies, citizens of Charlotte and of the county, sacrificing ease and the enjoyment of home and society of friends, departed on Friday night last, for Yorktown, to nurse and provide for the soldiers who may be sick at that point.

DIED.

We learn that Mr. E. N. HOWELL, a private in the Heron's Nest Riflemen of Charlotte, stationed at Yorktown, departed this life in camp on the 10th inst., after a short illness, occasioned by mumps and measles.

General Garnett.—The officer, who is now in north western Virginia, commanding the Confederate forces in that region, was a Major in the United States Army, and has for some years been in Washington Territory. He is a Virginian, and said to be an officer of uncommon ability, and regarded by General Lee with especial confidence.

If the recent reverse which it is reported has befallen our arms under Gen. Garnett, should be confirmed, it may be attributed, in a great measure, to the disloyalty of Virginians residing in that section. Not one in twenty can be trusted, and we fear when the truth of the misfortune reaches us, it will be seen that our defeat is due solely to information given by traitors.

A MEMBER FROM NORTH CAROLINA.

The New York Times' Washington correspondent, under date of July 3, sends the following:

Hon. Charles Henry Foster, of North Carolina, was duly elected on the 12th day of June last to represent the First District of North Carolina, and has arrived, with his certificate of election. Mr. Foster received all the votes cast in his district.

FUNDS FOR THE CONFEDERATE GOVERNMENT.

Our distinguished fellow-citizen, Hon. Walker Brooks, says the Vicksburg Whig, has just returned to this city. He informs us that he has succeeded in raising over \$400,000 for the Confederate Government, though he only addressed the people at five places.

A NORTHERN REBELLION.

The Harrisburg Union, a strong war journal, says that "daily attempts are now being made to array the army against the government, and to set up the military above the civil authorities; that if the war is not pushed with more vigor, the army will set upon its own responsibility; and that if a compromise is effected, three hundred thousand men in arms will not disband without administering law according to the code of Judge Lynch."

LINCOLN'S ARMY.

Secretary Cameron reports to the Federal Congress that there are 225,000 troops, regulars and volunteers, now in service, and 75,000 more not yet accepted. And that after 80,000 three months volunteers go home there will still be 220,000 in service.
