INVESTIGATION

The following ordinance was passed during last week at the County Court for Caswell County, for the support of indigent families of persons now in military service:

At a Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions, begun and held at the Courthouse in Caswell, on the 3rd Monday in July, A. D. 1861, a majority of the Justices being present, when Daniel Coleman, Esq., was appointed Chairman, and E. B. Henshaw, Esq., was appointed Secretary, and the following proceedings were had and entered on file to wit:

Ordered by the Court, That for the purpose of rendering aid and support to the indigent families of persons engaged in the military service of the State, that a sum of \$100,000,000, in such sums, and from time to time, as the Court hereafter may deem necessary, and for the purpose of negotiating said loan, and directing the application of it, the following persons are designated as a committee, to be called the Executive Committee, to wit: R. W. Allison, Esq., Dr. James F. Gilmer, and James Williford, Esq.

It is further ordered by the Court, That R. W. Allison have leave to negotiate such loan on such terms and in such amounts as he may deem expedient, and Daniel Coleman, Esq., give certificates as chairman, countersigned by the Clerk of the County Court, for such amount and cause the amount and date of each certificate, and the names of each person, or corporation, to which issued, to be recorded in a book kept for that purpose, and be (the chairman) shall cause said book to be laid before the Justices of the County Court, at every term of said Court, and at any time before the Committee of Finance, when required by the Court or Comptroller of Finance.

It is further ordered by the Court, That the said R. W. Allison enter into bond with sufficient security in the sum of eighty thousand dollars, payable to the State of North Carolina, conditioned for the faithful keeping and disbursing, and accounting for such moneys as he may obtain from time to time, which bond, when accepted by the Court, shall be recorded and registered and filed with the Clerk of the County Court for safe keeping.

And it is further ordered by the Court, That Geo. W. Kessler be appointed Comptroller to purchase from the farmers of the country such provisions as may be necessary for distribution among the families of such persons who are engaged in the military service of the State, or such that may hereafter be designated, and also draw upon the treasurer, R. W. Allison, for money, and to purchase from our own citizens and others, giving our own citizens the preference, when the article is the same in quality.

It is further ordered by the Court, That to prevent frauds and extravagance, that the aforesaid R. W. Allison, J. F. Gilmer, and James Williford, shall direct what amount of provisions or necessaries shall be distributed to each family weekly, on application, and the said Comptroller shall not distribute any more than the allowance so ordered, or cause the same to be distributed.

It is further ordered by the Court, That all families of volunteers who need assistance report themselves forthwith to the above committee, stating the number of members, age, sex, and mode of provisions wanted, so as to enable said committee to decide what amount may be necessary.

It is further ordered by the Court, That a majority of the members of the Executive Committee shall have power to act, and the County Court, at any regular term, may fill any vacancy in said committee, occasioned by death, resignation, removal or other inability to act, and a majority of the Justices may, at any time, abolish the above committee, or remove any member of it.

It is further ordered by the Court, That each member of the Executive Committee and Comptroller shall receive such compensation for their services as the County Court, a majority being present, to be paid by the County Treasurer, on certificate of the Clerk of the County Court.

It is further ordered by the Court, That the Committee of Finance, or such Committee as the Court may appoint, shall audit the accounts of the Treasurer and Comptroller at least once in thirty days, and report to the County Court, at each regular term, the state and condition of the finances.

It is further ordered by the Court, That out of the aforesaid \$400,000, the Executive Committee shall direct the treasurer to refund to each individual the amount subscribed and paid to defray the expenses of persons engaged in the military service heretofore organized, together and accepted, or for support of their families, provided the accounts of such expenses (subscriptions) shall be first audited by the Committee of Finance, and certified by their Chairman.

It is further ordered by the Court, That in order to facilitate our volunteers, or such persons going into the military service, that may hereafter be authorized and accepted by the State, to leave the County that the Executive Committee may advance such sums as may be deemed necessary for their subsistence.

It is further ordered by the Court, That the Treasurer have bonds issued, with coupons attached, payable in ten years after date, the interest semi-annually on the first day of January and July, in each year, by the Treasurer of the Executive Committee, or by such person as the Court may appoint, subject to any order made for a sinking fund, whereby the principal may be extinguished in less time than ten years.

It is further ordered by the Court, That J. J. Misenheimer act as Assistant Comptroller for the District of Mount Pleasant; Peter Cox, for Mill Grove Section, at Mill Grove; Mounce Melcher, at Pioneer Mills section; Thomas J. Shinn, for Bond's Mills section and neighborhood; who shall perform the same powers and parities, and be under the same restrictions as the principal Comptroller, Geo. W. Kessler.

We hope we may not be called upon to return them in like manner on like occasion; still they will ever be remembered and treasured as testimonials of our grateful pride.

Resolved, That the Secretary of this Lodge be instructed to forward a copy of these resolutions to the family of our deceased brother, and that they be published in the Banner and Watchman.

Resolved, That the members of this Lodge wear the usual badge of mourning for thirty days.
