From the Charlotte Bulletin, Feb. 23. THE ENEMY IN NASHVILLE. MEMPHIS, Feb. 24.—The Federal army entered Nashville yesterday. They say they will trouble nobody unless interfered with.

Gen. Price with his and McCulloch's Infantry are near Fayetteville. McCulloch is at Boston Mountain.

FACTORY BURNED. AUGUSTA, Feb. 23.—Shirley's Cotton and Wool Factory near Augusta, was burned last night. The loss is heavy. Nearly two hundred people have been thrown out of employment by this conflagration.

FROM NEW ORLEANS. NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 21.—News from the Rio Grande to the 7th instant, states that a British steamer, loaded with cotton at Matamoros by British merchants, was seized at the mouth of the Rio Grande by the Federal war steamer Portsmouth, and sent to Key West or New York, in charge of a prize crew.
