

General Order No. 14, and General Order No. 15, issued by Col. Peter Mallett, Commandant of Conscripts for North Carolina, Colonels of Militia will, on the 20th of August, 1863, enroll all persons liable to conscription under the recent Proclamation of the President of the Confederate States, and all persons so enrolled, will report themselves to the enrolling officer and Medical Board, at the following times and places, to wit:

**Cleveland County**—91st Regiment, Colonel Logan, Tuesday the 25th, and Wednesday the 26th of August, 90th Regiment, Colonel Elliott, Thursday 27th, and Friday the 28th of August.

**Lenoir County**—88th Regiment, Colonel Reynolds, Monday 31st, August and Tuesday 1st September.

**Gaston County**—87th Regiment, Col. Hand, Thursday 30, and Friday 4th of September.

**Mecklenburg County**—85th Regiment, Col. Maxwell, Monday the 7th and Tuesday the 8th of September, 86th Regiment, Colonel Brown, Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th September.

**Cabarrus County**—84th Regiment, Colonel Bumbart, Friday 11th and Saturday 12th September.

**Union County**—82d Regiment, Col. McCain, Monday 14th and Tuesday 15th, 119th Regiment, Colonel Mullis, Wednesday 16th and Thursday 17th September.

**Rowan County**—76th Regiment, Col. Bradshaw, Saturday 19th and Monday 21st September, 120th Regiment, Col. Locke, Tuesday 22d and Wednesday 23d September.

**Catawba County**—89th Regiment, Colonel Forney, Friday 25th and Saturday 26th September.

This Call includes all who shall have become 18 or over before the 20th of August, 1863, and all who are under 45 on that day, whether residents of any other portion of the State, or of any State, or claiming to be a citizen of any foreign State or Power—all who received exemptions as the owner or owners of (20) twenty negroes, as so much of the Exemption Act of October, 1862, as relates to overseers has been repealed by the act of May, 1863, to which the attention of all desiring the exemption of overseers is called. All persons discharged from the Army from any cause, or by any authority since the last enrollment. All persons to whom temporary exemptions were granted by the Examining Board, and all persons permitted by the Enrolling Officer to remain at home till further notice; persons exempted or detailed on any work for the State of North Carolina, or any department thereof, will be required to attend and exhibit the evidence of exemption or detail.

This call does not include persons exempted by the Examining Board on account of physical disability, (unless specially ordered,) nor persons exempted by the Enrolling Officer, at or since the last enrollment, (except overseers as above mentioned,) nor persons detailed for a limited time through the Conscription Office, at Raleigh, provided the details are in full force and effect on the 20th of August, and the parties are actually and diversely engaged in the business for which they were detailed.

If Colonels will return the Rolls to the Enrolling Officer, made out by Companies, with the full names plainly written, without erasure or alteration, on large size paper, only written on one side, with one column of names near the left margin, the balance of the page blank for remarks. If the Colonels have any reason to suspect that there are persons holding exemptions from the Enrolling Officer, or the Examining Board, not entered to them, obtained through fraud or mistake; or that there are persons properly exempted, whose disability has ceased to exist, or who have violated the conditions of their exemption by charging more than 75 per cent., by quitting or neglecting the business or profession for which they were exempted, or by engaging in any other pursuit, especially speculation and extortion, they will make separate roll of them, and have them together with sworn evidence before the Enrolling Officer. Reasonable notice must be given to all such suspected persons, so they may produce rebutting evidence, to the end that justice may be done.

All persons having business of any kind with the Enrolling Officer, must be present, together with all papers and evidence necessary for investigation and decision, while the officer is in the county where parties reside, then, if necessary, to defer, a time and place will be appointed. All papers and affidavits must be presented in due form and properly attested, to receive attention, as the Enrolling Officer will not have time to draw up or correct instruments of writing. All applications for exemption and all inquiries for information must be addressed to the Enrolling Officer only. All applications for exemption, on the ground of executive clemency, on account of justice, equity and necessity, must be presented to the Enrolling Officer, fortified by the sworn testimony of at least three disinterested and respectable persons—persons whose reliability the Enrolling Officer can endorse. All persons liable under this call, can volunteer before the 20th of August, and will be furnished with transportation on reporting to Col. Mallett, at Camp Holmes. Colonels of Militia will return to the Enrolling Officer a complete roll of all conscripts who thus volunteer, giving regiment and company, to which they have gone. To avail themselves of this right, parties must be actually in service with their regiments on the 20th day of August; furloughs, or permission to remain at home till after that time, if whomsoever granted, will be disregarded, and the parties sent to camp as conscripts, without delay. Conscripts sent to camp will have choice of regiments for as preference, and the exigencies of the service will allow. All soldiers who have been transferred to Salisbury Hospital, and permitted to return home, will promptly report to Dr. East, at Salisbury, or be arrested and treated as deserters.

The Enrolling Officer asks the aid of all officers of the militia, and of all good citizens in executing the law, and in raising men to drive the foul invaders from our soil.
