Belknap asks for \$26,000-000 for the War Department for the ensuing year, which is just \$1,000,-000 for each regiment in the service. Robeson has not yet made his demand, but will do so, of course, with his usual modesty. The Democrats have held a caucus, presided over by Mr. Lamar, in which the finance question was the principal subject of discussion. No line of policy has, as yet, been made out.
