Missildine, city commissioners C. W. Ballenger, F. P. Bacon, T. W. Ballew, Cemetery Commissioners T. H. Coggy, C. W. Ford, Mrs. Alice K. Missildine, School Board A. J. Jervey, James A. Lankford, D. S. Blois. All other city officers are appointed.
