Milk Testing Equipment Here

City Inspector Algie Wilson announces that all the testing equipment for grading local dairy milk had arrived and is being installed at the City Water Works laboratory where daily tests will be made of local cow milk. This will put the local milk supply on the highest basis of any town in the country. *An inspection a few weeks ago by government expert showed that every cow producing milk for Tryon was free of tuberculosis.*
