The Wear Knitting Co. of Tryon with plant at Lynn, will be sold to the highest bidder Friday, August 8 by the Trustee Chas. O. Smith. Bids will be reported to the Referee in Bankruptcy and proceedings taken on the report by 12 o'clock noon of August 9 at office of Jones and Massemburg. The Lynn mill is one of the oldest of its kind in the South. Mr. L. N. Wilcox built it about 30 years ago. It suffered one severe fire, but was promptly rebuilt.
