Insane Negro Leaves Hospital

Archie King, 23 year old colored man, and son of Will King, lost his mind yesterday at the hospital where he had been since Wednesday, and escaped to town about 2 p.m. Chief Wilson, Sheriff Wilkins and Constable Durham found him near the cemetery about 6 p.m. He put up a desperate fight to keep from being captured, but was finally lodged in Columbus Jail. Monday he will be taken to Goldsboro state insane asylum. King was considered a "good negro" until his illness.
