Enforcement Measure Ratified

RALEIGH, April 27.--The bill to amend and reenact the local law applying to Polk county, relative to the enforcement of the prohibition law, was ratified by the General Assembly Saturday. It was introduced by Senator W.K. McLean and provides for maximum fine of \$50, instead of a straight fine of \$25, or not more than 30 days in jail, for conviction for public drunkenness. --Asheville Citizen
