Now while eggs are cheap you should preserve them in either water-glass or lime-water. Both methods satisfactory for keeping eggs good for home use from 4 to 6 months. When eggs are high this fall, eat the preserved ones and sell the fresh ones. Use fresh, clean eggs. Dissolve 1 quart sodium silicate -water-glass- in 9 quarts water that has been boiled and cooled. Place mixture in large crock or jar. Place eggs in it, cover with waxed paper and place in cool, dry place. Solution should cover eggs two inches. Try this method out—it pays.
