County May Tax Five Cents

Polk and twenty-six other counties were included in the bill by Senator Johnson, providing that these counties may levy a special five-cent tax on the \$100 valuation of property to pay the costs of the quadriennial assessment of property, to pay the costs of courts and of maintaining jails and caring for prisoners.
