Highway Men Begin Grading Of Old Tryon Road; Detours Good

Practically all grading work on new stretches for the new Spartanburg-Tryon highway has been completed and work of grading the section of the present highway which will be a part of the new road has begun, according to R. W. Jones, resident engineer. Finishing touches are now being applied to the new stretches and forces will begin soon to prepare the present highway for the new concrete highway. Work began Thursday morning on construction of the 350-foot bridge which will span lowlands between Campobello and Landrum. The bridge will be the longest on the highway and will be constructed of concrete and reinforced steel. It will be about 20 feet high.
