A meeting of those interested in the Red Cross was held in office of Mr. Hester at 4 p.m. Tuesday. The Treasurer, Mr. Hester, reported cash on hand as \$128.48. Mrs. Geo. A. Cathey reported for the committee on Civilian Relief that they had spent about \$40, had distributed a good deal of clothing and had furnished necessary household utensils for a family that had been burned out. Mr. Schilleter reported that for Disaster Relief Committee for the farmers in the West we had contributed \$697 which was just \$3 less than the quota assigned us. It seemed to be the general opinion that the services of the Red Cross would be much needed this coming winter. The following officers and committee chairmen were appointed: President W. A. Schilleter, Secretary M. I. Plentye, Treasurer J. B. Hester, Sr., Roll Call Chairman Mrs. Hume Fraser, Civilian Relief Mrs. Geo. A. Cathey, Publicity S. T. Wood.
