Rutherford Has County Manager

Rutherfordton, N. C., Oct. 28..George H. Blanton, chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Rutherford, has been appointed county manager of Rutherford County under the laws of North Carolina. Since the county highway commission has been abolished and the county commissioners only hold two meetings a month it was deemed wise for the county to have a manager. Mr. Blanton is allowed the pay of a county commissioner, \$4 a day and mileage. This is the first time Rutherford has operated under the manager plan. *Spartanburg Herald.*
