Town Budget Made

The Town Commissioners met last night and adopted its budget for the coming fiscal year, a summary of which is published on back page of today's Bulletin. A more detailed statement is on file at the Town Office, at the Bulletin office and the News office for the benefit of any who may care to see it. The tax rate has been reduced from \$1.80 to \$1.75. The entire taxes for next year will be used to pay on the retirement of bonds and interest. And none of the tax money will be used to operate the Town as enough money is available from other sources for this purpose.
