Glass Wins Victory for Simplified Bill

Washington, Feb. 4. — Carter Glass of Virginia, smilingly announced today a major victory in his war against the phrase "and or" which has been springled through most recent federal statutes.

The senate appropriations committee eliminated the six "and or's" in the administration's work relief bill.

"A man who doesn't know whether he means 'and' or 'or' is unfit to write a statute," Glass commented.

Washington, Feb. 4.—The senate, almost without doing anything, has been making history.

For the second time in a week it ran out of business and adjourned until Wednesday.

"This is the first time in history, I believe, that the senate has been able to keep abreast of ready legislation," said Senator Robinson, the majority chief.
