Cloud Sponsors Second Bill On Board In Polk

Raleigh, March 5.—Beaten in his first attempt to increase the Polk county board of commissioners from three to six members, Representative E. B. Cloud has introduced a bill "to appoint additional members of the board of commissioners for Polk county upon petition of a majority of the qualified voters."

In his second bill, T. E. McKee, of Cooper's Gap township, W. A. Whiteside, of Columbus township, and J. Broadus Middleton, of Saluda township, would be named commissioners "provided such appointment shall be approved by duly verified petitions signed by a majority of the qualified voters" of Polk county, "the qualification of said voters to be determined by the registration and poll books, and other proper means."
