Raleigh, March 13. — The Polk county Democratic executive committee has filed a protest with the Democratic members of the legislature against the proposal of Repesentative E. B. Cloud to add three members to the Polk county board of commissioners upon petition of a majority of the qualified voters.

The Cloud measure, already passed the house and now pending before the senate committee on judiciary one, would add T. E. Mc-Kee of Cooper's Gap township, W.

About Fires

R. B. Williams, county game and forest warden gives the following concerning the prevention of fires in the county, caused by burning of fields and new-grounds:

"People having brush, fields and new grounds to burn off should notify the adjoining land-owners 3 days in advance, and should also notify him or the watchman at the tower on Tryon mountain. The phones are: Tower, 21-3R; warden's residence, 21-2R."

Mr. Williams also states that, "to be cautious with fires can be of considerable help in reducing the forest fires, saving the county considerable expense in fire fighting and loss of property." Mr. Wi liams also stated that those not notifying the adjoining land-owners are subject to a \$10.00 fine and costs.
