The land for the recreation ground and pool has already been donated, in the region of the principal colored section of town, and the Garden club is planning to help in raising money for the dam.

The program on the evening of April 13 will be given in the Parish House and will consist of songs by the children of the negro school, and old-time spirituals by the adult colored people.
