## Duke Donates To St. Luke's Hospital

Announcement has been made that the Duke Endowment has just allotted to St. Luke's hospital of Tryon \$1,544 for its charity work. This money represents \$1 per day per person for all persons receiving free treatment at the hospital. This amount had already been estimated in the budget of the local hospital. One dollar per day per person does not pay the full cost of hospital expenses which amount to \$4.20 per day per patient. This means that for every dollar Duke gives the hospital \$3.20 per day per patient must come from some other sources. The Duke Endowment is making similar donations to 105 other hospitals. The Baby Hospital at Saluda gets \$2,313 because it had more free patients. The total amount given by Duke was \$853,186.00. The Endowment believes in helping those who help themselves.
