Income Tax Notes

Washington, April 9. — Income taxes collected in North Carolina during March amounted to \$4,-367,719.86, as compared with \$3,-239,656.38 in March, 1934, according to figures made public today by the Burea uof Internal Revenue, based on telegraphic reports. The increase of \$1,128,963.48 is 34 per cent above the 1934 figure.

Commissioner Guy T. Helvering said an increase in receipts from income taxes occurred in every collection district except Hawaii. The total amount collected in March this year was \$321,726,348.39, compared with \$230,348,089.83 during the same period a year ago, an increase of \$91,379,258.56, or 39.7 per cent.—Asheville Citizen.
