Annual Horse Show Is Tryon's Largest

Liquidation Of Bank At Tryon Is Completed

Raleigh, April 16.—Gurney P. Hood, State bank commissioner, today reported completion of the liquidation of the First Bank and Trust company of Tryon, which closed in November, 1930.

Depositors got \$76,325.25 in dividends, or 58.208 per cent of their money, and those who made offsets got credit for \$19,054.84, or 100 per cent of their funds.

The bank closed with listed assets of \$280,406.72 on which \$137,114.05 was realized. Preferred claims of \$15,305.75 and secured claims of \$15,103.33 were paid in full.

The net cost of the liquidation was \$2,578.08.
