#### MAY PASS BALLOT BILL

Raleigh, April 28—With a restricted absentee ballot already voted for Haywood and McDowell counties, it is expected that other Western North Carolina counties will obtain similar legislation before the General Assembly

The senate elections committee gave an unfavorable report on Representative Cloud's bill to limit absentee voting in Polk County, but is expected to grant a favorable report to a somewhat similar bill introduced by Senator Thompson of Cleveland. The senator's bill would prohibit absentee voting for county, municipal and township offices.

Apparently, the Democratic leaders in Polk county favor a restricted absentee ballot law for Polk county but they want the measure to be sponsored by a Dem-

measure to be sponsored by a Democratic legislator and not by Representative Cloud of Polk, whose party affiliation has been an unsettled issue all session.

It is believed that the Thompson bill will be given a prompt favorable report by the senate elections' committee, assuring its passage early this week. The passage early this week. The house is expected to accept it in view of its favorable action on the original Cloud measure.
