

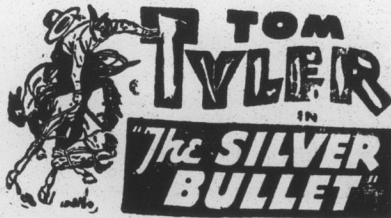
Famous Cows Will Be Here Saturday
