## Thompson's Cafe At Saluda Is Robbed

Saluda, June 10.—Frank Thompson's cafe, the Glenwood, was broken into and robbed Saturday night, sometime after the place had been closed for the night. The thieves entered by a rear window and helped themselves to the eatables in stock and such cigarettes and other things as took their fancy. They found a small sum of money in the cash till which they confiscated. The total loss amounts to between \$125 and \$150.—Asheville Citizen.
