Landrum, July 8.—Mrs. Harriett Ross Edwards, 69, wife of Thomas D. Edwards, of near Landrum, died this morning at a Rutherfordton N. C., hospital.

She had been in declining health for some time but was seriously ill only a short while.

Funeral services were held today at 3 p. m., at the Landrum Wesleyan church, conducted by the Rev. Mr. Cudd, the Rev. J. B. Connelly and the Rev. James Howard. Interment followed in the Landrum cemetery.
