New Sewerage System Needed

We want to call the attention of our readers to a page advertisement in this issue of The Bulletin which states the need of the Town of Tryon for a new sewerage system. FERA officials suggest that the Town borrow the \$25,000 needed since the Federal government will donate 45 percent of the money and loan the balance at 4 percent. The work can all be done at once under the best supervision. The Town would have to put in a new system anyway as the present system is in a bad condition. If we do not borrow from the government we will have to pay private sources the full amount and at a third additional interest. To borrow this money from the government now will not increase our tax rate one cent. If we wait and have to get the money elsewhere we will increase our tax rate about \$1 and also have to share part of the burden to help pay for what some other community received. Figures show that we will save considerable money by borrowing from the government NOW. Advise your Town Commissioners of your position.
