TRYON ARTIST DIES SUDDENLY

Homer Ellertson, 42, noted Tryon artist and author, passed away suddenly today about 11 o'clock as the result of a heart attack at his home in Gillette Woods. Burial services will be private on Friday afternoon. The deceased was a native of River Falls, Wis., but for the past 15 years had been a resident of Tryon.

Mr. Ellertson is survived by his widow, formerly Miss Margaret Lew, and by his mother and other relatives.
