Baynards Hurt In An Auto Accident

The following news item from a St. Petersburg (Fla.) paper of recent date, will be of interest to the friends of the Baynards, who are former Polk county residents:

"Lawrence W. Baynard, head of the Baynard Funeral home, 770 Fourth avenue north, and his sister, Mrs. Adelaide Stone, Sarasota, were injured, the former more seriously, around midnight last night when their car struck a cow on the highway near Live Oak, said reports reaching here today.

Neither was reported in any immediate danger, although reports here early this morning said Lawrence Baynard was in critical condition.

Walter Lee Baynard, real estate operator and brother of Lawrence, was also in the car at the time of the accident but escaped with only minor injuries, it was said.

The accident occurred at around midnight. The Baynards and Mrs. Stone, formerly of this city, were enroute to Hendersonville, N. C."
