county, Okla., died at Idabel. At Oklahoma City, where the mercury shot up to 102, John Nelson, 26, was prostrated.

Many communities reported the highest marks of the season. These included: Wellington, Kans., 110; Kansas City, Kans., 109; Bartlesville, Okla., 108; and Wichita, Kans., 107.

Kansas City, Mo., experienced 100 and the temperature at St. Louis topped 90 for the fifteenth consecutive day. Marks ranging from 95 to 100 prevailed in Iowa. In Nebraska, where about a score of the summer's heat fatalities have occurred, Lincoln had 99 yesterday compared with Tuesday's 97.—Asheville Citizen.
