## McDonald Announces For the Governorship

Dr. Ralph W. McDonald, of Winston-Salem, leader of the anti-sales bloc and champion of the schools in the 1935 General Assembly, today announced his candidacy for the Democratic nomination for governor of North Carolina.

"The problems which North Carolina faces center around taxation, government organization, education, and the social-economic welfare of the people of the state. My willingness to become a candidate for governor is based simply on the fact that my entire life has been devoted to a study of these problems", Dr. McDonald said.
