Resettlemen To Assist Farm Families In State

Farm families in North Carolina who are aided by the Resettlement Administration will be advanced funds for the purchase or lease of land, livestock, equipment and subsistence goods, according to Homer H. B. Mask, of Raleigh. N. C., Director of Rural Resettlement for Region IV, which is made up of Kentucky, North Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia.

"All advances will be properly secured by mortgages on real property, on personal property or on crops, and are repayable within a reasonable period," Mr. Mask said.

"The Resettlement program has to main phases," Mr. Mask added, "rehabilitation, the temporary phase, and resettlement, the permanent phase."
