Drivers' License

Have you got an application for your drivers' license yet? That has been the question the last two or three days. Some people didn't know that they would have to have a license have asked us about it. Here is the information: Every resident of North Carolina that drives an automobile or truck will be required to have a license. Until Nov. 1, 1935, it does not cost anything to apply for a license except when a Notary Public signs your application. If you get a highway patrolman to sign for you it doesn't cost anything. After Nov. 1, 1935, you will have to pay \$1 for the application and stand an examination. One of the patrolmen from Hendedsonville will be in Tryon one day next week to help the local autoists with their applications.
