The C. P. Rogerses To Attend Banquet At Grove Park Inn

Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Rogers of Tryon will attend the banquet and dance to be given tonight at Grove Park Inn in Asheville for prominent guests all over the nation. The Asheville Citizen today reports the following features scheduled for the occasion:

"Frances Perkins, Secretary of Labor of the United States, is scheduled to arrive in Asheville by train this morning from Washington. She will be the principal speaker at a banquet tonight at Grove Park Inn given by the International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commissions.

"Dr. Frank Graham, president of the University of North Carolina, and Governor Ehringhaus also are on the banquet program tonight. The toastmaster will be J. Dewey Dorsett, of Raleigh, president of the international organization. The response to the address of welcome will be made by Joseph A. Parks, of Boston, chairman of the department of industrial accidents of Massachusetts."

Ehringhaus Proclaims Parent-Teacher Week

Raleigh, Sept. 29. — Governor Ehringhaus today issued a proclamation calling upon the people of North Carolina to give their "Most careful and sympathetic attention" to the State Parent-Teacher association's membership drive, to be launched from October 15 to November 15.

The texts of the statement follows:

"To the people of North Carolina:

"Having been informed that October 15 to November 15 has been set aside as the period in which an effort will be made to extend the membership of the Parent-Teacher association in North Carolina, I am glad to bring this to the attention of our people, along with the suggestion that they give the most careful and sympathetic attention to this activity. The association busies itself primarily with the promotion of educational opportunity for our children, and membership in the association is committed to the ideal of educational improvement. I am sure that our people will give it the support which it deserves." — Charlotte Observer.
