Wilson, 29, who was killed in a government airplane crash in Hawaii on August 23, will be held Sunday afternoon at 1 o'clock at Big Level Baptist church in Polk county near Mill Spring. The Rev. H. J. Almond and Rev. C. B. ceased was a member of the Masonic lodge and local Masons will also take part in the funeral services. Private Wilson was a member of the Masonic lodge in Georgia while stationed at Ft. Benning for six years where he was an en-gineer in the aviation corps. He was in Hawaii about a year. The U. S. government is bringing the body to Tryon today (Thursday) on the afternoon train at 4:30. Private Chas. H. Fedder is the official escort for the body from New York.
