Landrum Land To Be Sold Saturday

A 250-acre tract on the North Pacolet river about six miles southeast from Landrum and two Landrum lots are to be sold by County Master LeRoy M. Moore at 10:30 a. m., Saturday on the 250-acre tract which is known as the W. C. Owens estate.

A four and a half acre tract located about one and a half miles from Landrum will also be sold at this time, all four pieces of realty being involved in the case of L. R. Owens et al., against Jesse Sane et el., a partition proceeding.
