R. B. Williams, game protector for Polk county, states that the Migratory Season open on November 20th and closes on Decmber. 19th. Mr. Williams states that a Federal fee of \$1 must be attached to the regular hunting licenses, and they can be secured at licenses selling places. Migratory water fowl can't be taken before sun-up nor after 4 p. m., and that they can't be baited or drove, by the use of any kind of boat.
