## Lady Astor And Son Win Election

Lady Nancy Astor running for re-election as a member of the British parliament won a big majority in English election held yesterday. Her son, young William Astor, running for the first time, defeated the Labor candidate, J. C. Wilmot, by 1050 votes. Most of the women lost their seats in the House of Commons. Lady Astor has represented her district since 1918.
